2022 - 2023

The action taken report for the academic year 2022-2023 is a direct response to the valuable feedback provided by the students of St. Aloysius College. This feedback, gathered by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) through online surveys, covers various aspects of the curriculum, teaching methodologies, infrastructure, and student support services. By addressing these concerns, the college aims to improve the overall student experience and uphold its commitment to providing quality education and a supportive campus environment.

The feedback was categorized into different areas such as curriculum design, teaching quality, campus infrastructure, and student services. The college administration has taken necessary steps to address the areas where improvements were needed while continuing to build on strengths identified by students. This action taken report outlines the key concerns raised by students, their specific feedback, and the actions implemented to resolve these concerns, ensuring continuous enhancement of academic and infrastructural standards at the college.

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

This Action Taken Report outlines the steps initiated by St. Aloysius College Elthuruth based on the feedback received from alumni for the academic year 2022-2023.
