#### Introduction

St. Aloysius College maintains an environment that promotes both academic and personal development because it places a high importance on the achievement and happiness of its students. The institution constantly asks students for feedback to ensure that its programs, facilities, and services adapt to changing needs. In order to better align policies, curriculum, and services with the goals and expectations of students, feedback is essential for continuous enhancement. The organization seeks opinions on a wide range of subjects, such as course content, relevance, creative learning, value system integration, and contributions to capacity building. Student feedback is an important tool for assessing expectations and experiences; it also identifies areas that need improvement in areas like campus infrastructure, curriculum, and instruction. This proactive approach demonstrates the college's commitment to transparency, accountability, and responsiveness in establishing a positive learning environment.

#### Methodology

In an attempt to raise the standard of instruction and enhance the overall student experience, St. Aloysius College's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a comprehensive student feedback mechanism for the 2021–2022 academic year. After extensive discussion, a special feedback committee was established to develop a Google Form that addresses every significant aspect of student life. The student feedback was gathered across three main sections:

#### **Basic Student Details**

This section gathered demographic information, such as students' academic backgrounds, to provide insights into respondents' diversity and their college experiences.



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#### Feedback on Curriculum, Teaching, and Learning Process

Students provided input on courses and teaching practices to evaluate curriculum alignment with industry trends and career preparation. Ratings on various aspects helped assess and improve the quality of academic programs.

#### Feedback on College Infrastructure, Facilities, and Student Support

This section assessed the quality of college facilities, such as the library and canteen, and student support services such as counseling services, mentorship programs, and financial aid counseling. Student ratings are vital for improving these resources and enhancing the overall learning environment.

#### **Rating Scales**

To gather useful insights, students rated each aspect of their experience using the following scales, which were applied to both the curriculum and the college's infrastructure:

#### **Data Analysis and Visualization**

The student feedback from 2021–2022 offers valuable insights into the overall experience, facilities, and quality of instruction at St. Aloysius College. The feedback covers areas like the effectiveness of the curriculum, teaching quality, and student support services. Both qualitative and quantitative methods were used to assess the responses. For the quantitative

portion, a five/ten -point rating scale was used to measure agreement and satisfaction levels.

#### The analysis focuses on several key areas

Feedback on Curriculum: This section evaluates how effectively the curriculum promotes holistic development, meets societal needs, and offers practical learning opportunities like internships and fieldwork.

**Feedback on Teaching and Learning:** This section assesses the effectiveness of teaching, faculty engagement in student development, and overall satisfaction with the learning environment.

Feedback on College Infrastructure and Facilities: This section evaluates the adequacy of campus facilities, including the library and canteen, as well as the availability of student support services.




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#### Section 2: Feedback on the college's infrastructure and support services




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#### **Key Findings and Analysis**

#### 1. Curriculum and Teaching

- 1. Students rated holistic development and practical skills as moderate (mean: 3.52 and 3.56 respectively).
- 2. Opportunities for internships and fieldwork were rated low (mean: 2.61), suggesting a need for more real-world learning experiences.
- 3. Use of ICT tools in teaching was also rated low (mean: 2.79), indicating that technology integration could be improved.

#### 2. Infrastructure and Support

1. Library resources received a positive rating, with an average score of 3.85. However, other facilities, such as the canteen and administrative services, were rated around 6 on a 10-point scale, indicating room for improvement.

#### 3. Mentorship and Career Guidance

1. Teacher mentorship and career guidance were rated moderately (mean: 3.34 and 3.32 respectively), with room for improvement in both areas.





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#### **Recommendations for Improvement**

#### 1. Curriculum Enhancements

- 1. Increase opportunities for internships, fieldwork, and real-world learning experiences to better prepare students for their careers.
- 2. Focus on the integration of ICT tools in the teaching process to enhance the learning experience.

- 2. Conduct further assessments of the canteen and administrative services to identify areas for improvement.


#### 3. Mentorship and Career Support






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#### Analysis of the Feedback on College Infrastructure and Support Services

#### **Infrastructure Maintenance**



The quality of academic resources and facilities could be enhanced. Modernizing research facilities and providing access to cutting-edge technology would improve the student learning experience and professional readiness.

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





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

Here, 43.8% responds as excellent to the question, 31.3% responds to good and 18.8% are on average and the rest responds as bad.





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
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
